F1: So, can you tell what are types of machine learning? (Told supervised, unsupervised, reinforcement)

- told about domestic. Weight of commercial cylinder slipped out of my mind so I said sorry sir I cannot recall at the moment. He told that it is 19 kilograms.

- Then I remembered and added that along with 19 kilograms we also produce cylinders from 5 kilograms upto 450 kilograms for commercial use.

P1 : How are the weights decided ? Who decides that cylinders will be 14.2 kg for domestic and 19 or 47.5 or 450 for commercial.

- I wasn't aware of this.

Over to P2.

P2: Do you know what has happened with byjus recently

-told.

P2: what was the reason behind this downfall?

- told that the indian e learning ecosystem was not able to cope up with post lockdown situation due to a sudden drop in the number of users. Apart from that byjus had borrowed 1.2 billion dollars from investors in US and failed to pay back which led to a lawsuit being filed and byju's ended up losing the case and lost the control of byju's alpha, US based arm of byju's.

P2: But what is the problem. It is their money, it is not public's money. No one is losing anything due to its downfall then why is there so much news about it?

- talked about how it is affecting thousands of students and their parents who have paid lakhs of rupees for their courses. Many of the parents had taken loans for paying their fees. Then there are employees whose future is uncertain. More than 5000 of them have already been laid off.

P2: what is the difference between a shareholder and lender?

-told

Meanwhile the alumni *(A)* went through my form and asked

"Your area of interest is operations and Supply chain and you've mentioned you wish to work for Amazon in future. Why Amazon? "

- told about the recent innovations in warehouse automation in amazon. Acquisition of keva systems (later renamed as Amazon robotics), use of automated robots for warehouse operations and the resulting improvement in warehouse capacities and reduction in time taken for order processing.

P2: can you tell me what is the difference between logistics and supply chain ?

- told. He seemed satisfied. No further questions.

A: dont you think the automation systems employed by amazon may lead to unemployment in India if introduced here ? For us wouldn't it be better to have humans working in the warehouses?

- talked about how these robots make the job of humans easier and are meant to increase their speed and efficiency, not completely replace them. Also talked about how jobs are divided in these warehouses between humans and robots.

A: Are you aware of the entire process that takes place in the refinery right from the start?

-I started telling the step by step process. He interrupted in between

A: okay. How do you ship the products out of your refinery?

- told about railway gantry, tanker trucks and pipelines.

P1: Do you have any questions?

- I have read that IIM Calcutta has an operations club along with many others. Is there any prerequisite knowledge I need to have to get into it ? And what is the selection process?

P1: Each club has it's own selection process. There are some prerequisites for each club but dont worry you'll be guided by your seniors once you reach there.

M1: So, what is the talk outside about this panel?

Me: Heard that it is very conversational. (All of them smiled)

M1: Do you want it to be conversational or technical?

Me: I would prefer if it was conversational.

M1: So, you are from an English Literature background? You must have learned about the language as well. This is a serious question. Listen to this carefully. (started giving me a scenario which went on for atleast 2 to 3 min) So there is ambiguity in the English language. For example, when I say 'Get Lost' it can mean different things based on the context, like get out of the room or shit as in an expression of surprise. Considering that you are an expert in this language, I approach you for a task. You will be provided with any amount of money, any number of resource people and anything that you need. I need you to solve a problem for me. You are supposed to write an essay, which can range from 1 page to 1 million pages, I don't care. The essay should analyze and explain the ambiguity in English. A person who reads this essay should be able to use English without ambiguity. Is it possible to eliminate the ambiguity in English using these criteria? (By this time M2 and F were looking at each other and laughing silently)

Me: (I had been staring intently at M1 for all this while trying to comprehend this entire question of 2 min) Asked a couple of cross questions, took 1 min to think and said that I think we can resolve the ambiguity but whether it's possible upto a 100% is questionable. Started on how I would use William Empson's Seven Types of Ambiguity theory to describe on this... (got interrupted)

M1: (Shook his head) I will repeat the scenario...(Went on to repeat the conditions, stressing on the inherent ambiguity in the language) Why do you think it isn't completely possible?

Me: Tried talking about the influences on the language, prolonged history of evolution, gendered terms and lack of cultural equivalencies etc.

M1: Gave further hints on the question.

Me: Was trying hard to think of the right answer to this. By now I realized that the ambiguity cannot be resolved but wasn't able to immediately answer why.

M1: I won't trouble you too much over this language question. So English is inherently an ambiguous language ryt? Even if we write a million pages about the ambiguity in English, the language used is still ambiguous. So we cannot remove ambiguity with ambiguity. Think on those lines.

Now, what is the probability that atleast 2 other women in this entire world will have the same number of hairs that you have on your head? Explain mathematically.

Me: I was both amused and bewildered by now. And smiling quite much.

M1: Do you think that it is possible for 2 other women to have the same number of hairs? What can be the number of hairs on a woman's head? Thousands, Lakhs, millions?

Me: Ermmm, I think it is possible sir. I don't know the exact number, but I think it can be a few thousands. I only know that a normal hairfall level is upto 100 strands per day.

M1: Okay, so how can we prove mathematically that this happens?

Me: I am not exactly getting the mathematical approach to it. I am not sure, but I think we can approach this through binomial distribution.

M1: (Shook his head) See I am a very old man, all this binomial distribution and mathematical terms, I don't know. Explain using Math how the other 2 people will have the same number of hairs.
